MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

5783-2022/2023 was another year of bringing together our community. We started the year off continuing with our programming throughout the areas we serve. After the sad and shocking events of October 7th, 2023 our community came together to support, reflect and rally for peace.

The Burquest JCA manages the Burquest Jewish Community Centre in Coquitlam, providing a place for our diverse Jewish community to connect. The working Board of Directors plans and supports a range of activities together with staff programmers and and our administrator. Our programming and events help Jewish families, adults and seniors thrive and connect with their community. We look forward to the year ahead where we can provide even more programs and events to connect our community.



The Burquest JCA strives to provide space and services for Jews in Vancouver's eastern suburbs, primarily at the Burquest JCC. This report's time frame ends with the start of 5784 in Sept 2023. But the Hamas attack on Israel shortly thereafter, and subsequent anti-semetic statements and events, highlight the value of having a local organization and Centre where we can gather, try to console, debate, and pray for peace. As a public space for the local community, we will look outward while keeping in mind our core mission, as listed below.



- 1.Jewish people will feel a sense of home and community at Burquest and support the organization.
- 2.Jewish people will enjoy access to engaging programs that connect them to each other and their heritage.
- 3.The Burquest Jewish Community Centre (BJCC) will be known as a hub for the Jewish Community in the Tri-Cities and beyond.
- 4. Burquest will have clarity in its goals and focus on fundraising.
- 5.Jewish people in the Tri-Cities area will feel their interests are reflected in Burquest's decisions and programming

Burquest made significant progress towards each of these goals. Our programs better reflect the community and participation has skyrocketed. Burquest programs diversified to include social events in Hebrew, family gatherings, and differing ritual activities. We have established stronger ties and relationships with other Jewish institutions for collaborations. We have expanded our staffing structure, and introduced a new and more modern website.

The year 2023 proved challenging, with Covid restrictions lessening but with soaring inflation and the rising costs of everything. We are so grateful to Jewish Federation of Greater Vancouver, which has increased their funding of our programs this year, we continuously struggle to make programs affordable while ensuring the financial sustainability of Burguest.

Burquest is run by a dedicated volunteer board in addition to a multitude of other volunteers that take on a myriad of activities supporting operations and programs. For most of us, time is the most precious resource we have and it is not without some level of sacrifice that we all contribute to Burquest. I am in awe of the people who contribute their passion, energy, care, and commitment to ensuring that Burquest can accomplish our vision.





HIGHLIGHTS OF 2022/2023

Our team at Burquest came together to celebrate events in the community as well as find new opportunities to connect. As a Board, we have brainstormed new ideas to attract new membership across the Tri-Cities and continue to do so. Our aim is to support Jewish life for all the members of our community.

Well Attended Holiday Events

Burquest made a point of hosting a variety of unique and diversified events throughout the year. The most well-attended events were during Purim, Chanukah and Shavuot. All of these events had record attendance and we received positive feedback following the event.

Collaborating Across the Community

On many occasions, Burquest collaborated with other Jewish agencies across Metro Vancouver as well as the newly established Chabad in the Tri-Cities. By partnering with these organizations, we are able to increase our reach in the community and offer a wider range of events.

Diversified Board of Directors

Burquest has a diverse Board in terms of age, skills and experience. This group of volunteer Board members helps to shape the future of Burquest in a positive way, enabling unique discussion to improve what we offer to the Jewish community.

Volunteerism in the Community

EVENTS

Burquest is so proud of the events it hosted in 2022/2023. Burquest found the means to pull together the Jewish community in a variety of ways. Events ranged from shabbat services, seminars to celebratory events. Here's some of the top events & programs attended in 2022/2023.

High Holiday Services

Burquest's High Holiday services were largely led by long-time Burquest member David Medzon, highly participatory, and emotionally satisfying for attendees. We were supported by Cantor Frani Goodman's passionate chanting during the Days of Awe The schedule included the outdoor Tashlich service, shofar blowing and the Yizkor remembrance service on Yom Kippur. Child activities were provided on specific mornings, and the services were accessible through Zoom for remote participation.

Burquest Past Present and Future: a video history

Burquest produced and made avaikable a film documenting its founding and history. The 37 minute film includes interviews conducted in 2021 with founders and leaders of the Burquest Jewish Community between 1972 and 2021. It focuses on the community's origin in Burnaby in the early 1970s, purchase of a building in Coquitlam in 2021, through our operations at that site up to today. It includes interviews with co-founder Max Jacobson z"l and an early President Bill Gruenthal, with archival photos from the earliest events. The emphasis shifts to the process leading to the purchase of the current BJCC in Coquitlam, and includes videos from our first event at the building in May 2021. It concludes with leaders talking about program directions taken at the BJCC in the following 20 years.

We premiered the video at the BJCC in June 2023, and used the event also to honour substantial financial donors to the community via upgrades on our major donor board. The video project was led by Zanna Linskaia and Rudy Rozanski, working with producer Lior Noyman. It was scored with original music written by Rozansk and performed by a violin, cello, and piano trio including himself. The film can be viewed at:

End-of-Life Decision Making Class

Rabbi SaraLeya Schley led a three-part class exploring how the wisdom of the Rabbis informs end-of-life decisions. The class delved into the psycho-spiritual states of illness and dying, the value of human life, and autonomy in medical decision-making, using the lens of secular legislation permitting Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID).

Book Club


We have been fortunate to have been able to read, enjoy and chat about four books this year, namely;


- The Finkler Question by Howard Jacobson

- The Weight of Ink by Rachel Kadish


We were also very fortunate to have had the pleasure of the two local authors, Gloria Levi and Marie Doduck, visiting Burquest, reading from their books and answering our questions.


Our group usually meets online, but we recently experimented with a hybrid model which included real coffee, real cookies and a computer screen for our zoomed-in participants.

Community Kitchen Club

The Burquest Community Kitchen Club, under the expert guidance of the passionate and talented Zanna Linskaya, has been a hub of culinary creativity and camaraderie. Members gathered regularly to embark on exciting culinary adventures, learning from renowned Chef Asia and engaging in a variety of events that tantalized the taste buds and celebrated diverse culinary traditions.

Chef Asia's Cooking Classes: One of the highlights of the Community Kitchen Club has been the exclusive cooking classes led by the acclaimed Chef Asia. Members have had the opportunity to sharpen their culinary skills and explored a myriad of cuisines under Chef Asia's expert guidance. The classes not only provided hands-on experience but also fostered a sense of community and shared love for good food.

Overall, our outreach programs for seniors for the last year have been successful. We continued our singing group twice per month and community kitchen club with the concerts by singing group and delicious luncheons by our kitchen club. Also Culinary art class with chef Asia who offered her original recipes was very popular and loved by participants.

In the frame of Hebrew-English conversations there have been introductions to Siddur, customs and traditions of Jewish holidays, last news in Israel, Canada and all over the world, presentations of literature, poetry, music, etc. by our members - Z.Linskaia, E.Rozenberg, M.Tverskoy, A.Kobiliansky and our guests with refreshments and treats.

Group of seniors - fans of classical music regularly go at musical matinees at Evergreen with reception and duo Bergmann.

Our own musical trio with violin (A.Kobiliansky), piano (R.Rozanski) and cello(Yu Tsai) became sensation for Burquest members and guests. We had a number of their concerts with masterpieces of baroque, classical and romantic music by famous composers with following receptions.

Special seniors' events such as a trip to Van Dusen garden, picnics for Shavuot, Good bye summer, Tu beShvat seder, celebration of Complimentary Day, Festival of lights, Hanukah latkes party, lunches on the road - are attended by 15 - 25 people. Burquest Annual Report for Fiscal Year 5783: Advancing Our Mission with Financial Transparency

In the spirit of transparency and commitment to our mission, Burquest presents the annual report for the fiscal year 5783. 


